The center offers an array of activities designed to educate and inspire. Marvel at elephant shows where these magnificent creatures demonstrate their intelligence and strength, and gain insights into their daily care and training. Participate in interactive experiences such as bathing elephants in the river—an activity that highlights their playful and sociable nature. The center also houses a hospital dedicated to elephant health, underscoring its role as a sanctuary for their well-being. Additionally, visitors can explore the on-site museum and learn about the history and cultural significance of elephants in Thailand, making it a deeply enriching experience for all ages.

The villa's creation was part of the Princess Mother's broader Doi Tung Development Project—a transformative initiative focused on reforesting the area, reducing opium cultivation by offering alternative livelihoods, and promoting sustainable living among local communities. Adjacent to the villa lies the Mae Fah Luang Garden, a beautifully curated botanical space bursting with color and fragrance. Its diverse collection of flowers and plants changes throughout the year, offering visitors a mesmerizing and peaceful experience that mirrors the rhythm of the seasons. Together, the Doi Tung Royal Villa and Mae Fah Luang Garden showcase not only natural beauty and architectural ingenuity but also tell an important story of royal initiative, environmental restoration, and cultural preservation in Thailand.

Next, travel to Mae Sai District, Thailand's northernmost district, offers a unique experience due to its proximity to Myanmar.
