This research station focuses on winter plants, ornamental flora, and highland fisheries, while actively supporting forest watershed conservation and improving the livelihoods of nearby hill tribe farmers. Stroll through the meticulously maintained gardens, where a kaleidoscope of blooms showcases the station's commitment to botanical research and preservation. Beyond its scenic appeal, the station plays a vital role in sustainable agriculture and environmental conservation, empowering local communities with resources and knowledge. This harmonious blend of nature and sustainable development makes the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon an inspiring start to your journey through Doi Inthanon National Park. After admiring the flower and vegetable plots at the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon, continue your journey to visit the beautiful Wachirathan Waterfall, one of Thailand's most awe-inspiring natural wonders. Nestled in the heart of Doi Inthanon National Park, this 70-meter-high cascade offers a mesmerizing spectacle that never fails to enchant its visitors. The waterfall flows robustly year-round, ensuring a dazzling display no matter when you visit. During the rainy season, the scene becomes even more magical, with vibrant rainbows frequently arching across the mist-filled air, adding a fairytale-like quality to the setting. The water tumbles dramatically down the rugged cliff, generating a refreshing mist that cools the surrounding air—a perfect retreat on warm days. The ambiance around Wachirathan Waterfall is both serene and invigorating, enhanced by the lush green forest that envelops it. Towering trees, vibrant ferns, and a diverse array of tropical plants form a living tapestry of natural beauty, making it a truly enchanting destination.

Your journey through Doi Inthanon National Park continues with a visit to the majestic Twin Royal Pagodas: Phra Mahathat Naphamethanidol and Phra Mahathat Naphaphonphumisiri. These two stunning structures, perched atop the mountain, offer breathtaking panoramic views of the expansive landscape, which stretches as far as the eye can see. The area enjoys cool weather for most of the year, adding to its charm. Phra Mahathat Napamethanidol was built to honor and pay homage to Phra Bat Somdet Phra Paraminthra Maha Bhumibol Adulyadej Rama IX during the auspicious celebration of His Majesty the King's 5th cycle birthday in 1987. Similarly, Phra Mahathat Naphaphonphumisiri was constructed as an offering to Her Majesty Queen Sirikit during the celebrations on the auspicious occasion of Her Majesty the Queen's 5th cycle birthday in 1992. The area surrounding the pagodas is beautifully landscaped with gardens featuring vibrant winter flowers and a variety of plants. The Twin Royal Pagodas are among the most popular tourist attractions in Doi Inthanon National Park, consistently drawing a steady stream of visitors throughout the year.

A visit to Doi Inthanon National Park is crowned by the exhilarating ascent to Doi Inthanon, Thailand's highest peak, towering at 2,565 meters above sea level. Part of the Thanon Thongchai Mountain range, which extends from the Himalayas, this iconic peak offers diverse climates and ecosystems, making it a paradise for nature lovers. The journey to the summit is a feast for the senses. As you ascend, landscapes transform from lush rainforests to serene pine groves and mixed forests, each teeming with rare flora and fauna. Cool, misty weather and sweeping views of the surrounding mountains create a serene and invigorating atmosphere. A memorial to King Inthawichayanon, a conservation pioneer and former ruler of Chiang Mai, highlights the park's cultural and ecological significance. Whether drawn by stunning vistas, diverse ecosystems, or cool mountain air, Doi Inthanon offers an unforgettable blend of natural beauty and cultural heritage, making it a must-visit for adventurers and nature enthusiasts alike. As the day winds down, you will continue to Mae Hong Son, where you will check into your hotel for the night. DAY 02 Mae Hong Son – Pai: Su Tong Pe Bamboo Bridge / Ban Ruam Thai (Pang Oung) / Ban Rak Thai village / Lahu Hill Tribe Village (Ban Ja Bo) / Doi Kiew Lom Viewpoint / Pai Walking Street (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Start your Mae Hong Son exploration with a visit to the stunning Su Tong Pe Bridge, Thailand's longest bamboo bridge. Spanning over 500 meters, this remarkable structure connects Suan Tham Phusama Temple with Kung Mai Sak village. A masterpiece of local craftsmanship, the bamboo bridge offers panoramic views of rice paddies and tranquil canals, showcasing the ingenuity and artistry of the region's artisans. The bridge is especially captivating during the rainy season when the

surrounding area is covered with lush green rice fields and turns golden as winter sets in, with distant mountains forming a picturesque backdrop. Farmers tending to their fields add a touch of authentic rural charm, while the gentle sway of the bamboo and the soft rustle of leaves create a soothing, meditative ambiance. Each season reveals its own distinct beauty: earthy tones and rustic warmth in the dry season, and glistening golden fields under bright winter skies. No matter the time of year, the Su Tong Pae Bridge offers a unique and unforgettable experience, blending natural beauty with cultural heritage in perfect harmony.

Walking along the bridge feels like stepping back in time, offering a glimpse into an era of hardship and transformation. The Memorial Bridge stands as a testament to the strength and perseverance of those who lived through the war, carrying stories of sacrifice, bravery, and endurance. It invites visitors to pause, pay tribute to the past, and honor the memories of those who traversed its spans during wartime. More than just a historical landmark, the bridge is a place of quiet contemplation and remembrance. Its weathered planks and enduring presence forge a profound connection to history, while the surrounding area's serene ambiance and scenic views deepen the reflective mood. When visiting Pai District, the Memorial

Bridge is not only a historical treasure but also a reminder of the town's resilience and the enduring spirit of its people. It offers a space to reflect on the lessons of the past and appreciate the journey that has shaped the present.

Bid farewell to Pai and continue your journey to Mae Taeng District, where you'll find the Pong Dueat Hot Spring, Northern Thailand's largest geyser hot spring. The spring's underground water, heated to temperatures ranging from 170–200°C, bursts to the surface in dramatic jets of steam that soar 1–2 meters into the air. Surrounding the spring, you'll discover several tranquil ponds nestled within a dense jungle, along with a 1.5-kilometer nature trail that winds through this lush landscape. This circular route invites visitors to immerse themselves in the area's rich biodiversity, showcasing towering trees, vibrant moss, and delicate ferns. Along the path, informative signs offer fascinating insights into the hot spring's geology and the local flora. The gentle sulfuric scent in the air and the serene surroundings create a peaceful, almost otherworldly atmosphere, making the visit both relaxing and educational. Whether you're captivated by the natural wonders or seeking a tranquil escape, Pong Dueat Hot Spring offers a unique and rejuvenating experience. Finally, your journey leads back to Chiang Mai, where you'll transfer to your hotel.
