Your journey through the stunning landscapes of Mae Taeng continues with a visit to the impressive Pong Dueat Hot Spring. This natural wonder boasts the title of the largest hot spring in the region, captivating visitors with its unique geothermal

activity. The spring's most striking feature is its geyser-like eruption, where a forceful jet of scalding water and steam shoots up to a height of 1-2 meters. This mesmerizing display is fueled by the intense heat beneath the Earth's surface, with temperatures ranging from 170 to 200 degrees Celsius underground. At the surface, the water cools to a still-impressive 90 to 100 degrees Celsius. As you explore the surrounding jungle, you'll embark on a 1.5-kilometer circular trail that winds through a lush, verdant forest. Along the way, you'll encounter towering trees, delicate ferns, and vibrant moss, offering a glimpse into the region's diverse ecosystem. Informative signboards provide valuable insights into the geological processes that power the hot spring and the unique flora that thrives in this environment.

After enjoying exploring the forest around the Pong Dueat Hot Spring, continue your journey to Pai along a historic road that played a crucial role during World War II. As you wind your way up and down the steep, winding roads, you'll be rewarded with breathtaking panoramic views of the majestic mountains. The landscape unfolds with every twist and turn, offering glimpses of lush valleys and soaring peaks that seem to touch the sky. This scenic drive is an adventure in itself, providing countless opportunities to stop and take in the natural beauty that surrounds you. The larger pagoda, constructed in 1860, is a testament to the devotion of Chong Thong Su a Shan merchant, while the smaller one, built in 1874, was commissioned by Phraya Singhanatracha the first ruler of Mae Hong Son, in addition to the Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu Temple, you'll have the opportunity to explore the nearby Wat Chong Kham and Wat Chong Klang temples. These stunning structures showcase exquisite Burmese-style architecture and house revered Buddha images, including Luang Paw To. The temples are further adorned with intricate Burmese wood carvings and captivating glass paintings depicting significant Buddhist stories.

Lunch at the restaurant.

After admiring the art of various temples in Mae Hong Son city, continue your journey to Su Tong Pe Bridge, the longest bamboo bridge in Thailand. This remarkable structure, spanning over 500 meters, connects Suan Tham Phusama Temple with Kung Mai Sak village, offering a picturesque view of the surrounding paddy fields and canals. The bridge, constructed entirely from locally sourced bamboo, showcases the ingenuity and craftsmanship of local artisans, providing a vital link for the community and a stunning attraction for visitors. The Su Tong Pae Bridge is particularly stunning during the rainy season when the golden rice fields contrast beautifully with the lush greenery and towering mountains. The bridge seems to float above the fields, creating a serene and almost ethereal landscape. As you walk along the bridge, you can see farmers working in the fields, their silhouettes against the backdrop of the verdant hills. The gentle swaying of the bamboo beneath your feet and the soft rustling of the leaves add to the tranquil ambiance, making this a perfect spot for reflection and appreciation of nature's beauty. In addition to the rainy season, each season offers its own unique charm. During the dry season, the fields take on a different hue, with earthy tones that highlight the natural beauty of the land. Among the culinary highlights is the renowned Chinese tea, considered to be of the highest quality in the Mae Hong Son province. The Royal Twin Pagodas are among the most popular tourist attractions in Doi Inthanon National Park, consistently drawing a steady stream of visitors throughout the year.
