DAY 01 Chiang Mai Arrival (Hotel)

DAY 02 Chiang Mai Sightseeing: Doi Inthanon National Park / Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon / Wachiratharn Waterfall / Grand Pagodas (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Dedicated to the study of winter crops, ornamental plants, and highland fisheries, the station also plays a vital role in forest watershed conservation and in enhancing local livelihoods. It actively supports nearby hill tribe communities by sharing agricultural knowledge, resources, and sustainable practices that help improve their quality of life. As you wander through the beautifully landscaped gardens, you'll be surrounded by a kaleidoscope of blossoms that reflect the station's deep commitment to botanical research and environmental stewardship. More than just a scenic attraction, the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon stands as a symbol of harmony between nature and sustainable development, offering visitors an inspiring and educational beginning to their exploration of Doi Inthanon National Park.

After enjoying the vibrant gardens and agricultural exhibits, continue your adventure to one of Thailand's most breathtaking natural landmarks—the majestic Wachirathan Waterfall. Nestled deep within the lush expanse of Doi Inthanon National Park, this towering 70-meter cascade offers a spectacular visual and sensory experience that captivates everyone who visits. The waterfall maintains a strong flow throughout the year, ensuring that its dramatic beauty can be appreciated in every season. During the rainy months, the scene becomes even more enchanting, as shimmering rainbows often form in the misty spray, creating a magical, storybook atmosphere. The water thunders down the rugged cliff face with impressive force, generating a cool, refreshing mist that blankets the area and offers a pleasant respite on warmer days. The ambiance is both tranquil and invigorating, enhanced by the dense forest canopy

that envelops the falls. Towering trees, lush ferns, and a rich variety of tropical flora create a vivid natural tapestry, making Wachirathan Waterfall not only a visual masterpiece but also an immersive experience in Thailand's pristine wilderness.

Its companion, Phra Mahathat Naphaphonphumisiri, was built in 1992 to commemorate Her Majesty Queen Sirikit's fifth-cycle birthday, serving as a tribute to her enduring grace and devotion to the Thai people. Surrounding the pagodas are beautifully landscaped gardens, bursting with vibrant winter blooms and a variety of ornamental plants that thrive in the cool highland climate. These sacred structures are not only architectural masterpieces but also cultural landmarks that attract visitors year-round, who come to admire their beauty, pay their respects, and soak in the tranquil ambiance of the mountaintop.

From the pagodas, continue onward to the summit of Doi Inthanon—the highest peak in Thailand, standing proudly at 2,565 meters above sea level. As part of the Thanon Thongchai Mountain Range, which extends from the Himalayas through Nepal, Bhutan, and Myanmar, Doi Inthanon is both a geological and ecological treasure. The ascent to the summit takes you through an enchanting transition of forest types, from lush rainforests and fragrant pine groves to mixed woodlands, each brimming with unique flora and fauna. Upon reaching the peak, you'll be rewarded with breathtaking views stretching across valleys and ridgelines, a spectacle that captivates travelers from around the world. The crisp mountain air provides a refreshing contrast to the warmer lowlands, making the summit an ideal spot for peaceful reflection and rejuvenation. DAY 03 Chiang Mai - Chiang Rai: Hinoki Land / Roi Jai Rak Project / Akha hill tribe Village / Doi Mae Salong / Wat Huay Pla Kang Temple (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Embark on an enchanting journey from Chiang Mai to the breathtaking Chiang Rai, a land of natural wonders and cultural gems. Begin your adventure at the Hinoki Land, a unique attraction that seamlessly blends Japanese art, culture, and architecture with the scenic beauty of Thailand. Spanning an impressive 32 acres area, Hinoki Land is the country's first and only hinoki wood kingdom, designed to transport visitors into a captivating Japanese atmosphere. At the entrance, a grand red lantern arch welcomes visitors, symbolizing good luck and prosperity. A tunnel of 88 pairs of torii gates guides guests toward the centerpiece of the attraction: the majestic Hinoki Castle. Inspired by Kyoto's iconic Kinkakuji Castle, this stunning structure is a testament to the intricate craftsmanship and attention to detail that defines Japanese architecture. Surrounded by mountainous and forested terrain, Hinoki Land provides a serene and picturesque setting for visitors to immerse themselves in Japanese culture.

Then, the journey take you to Ban Huai San Village in Mae Ai District, where cultural discoveries, picturesque landscapes, and vibrant markets await. Begin your visit at the Roi Jai Rak Project, a thoughtful initiative managed by the Mae Fah Luang Foundation under the Royal Patronage of His Majesty the King. The project's main goal is to enhance the quality of life for the local hill tribe communities by creating employment opportunities and generating income. The project encompasses Suan Roi Jai Rak, a delightful garden plantation showcasing a variety of winter flowers and vegetables for visitors to admire. Additionally, explore Kad Luang Roi Jai Rak, a market where villagers present high-quality produce, including fresh vegetables, fruits, and flowers, along with intricate handicrafts for tourists to peruse and purchase.

Next, immerse yourself in the fascinating culture, traditions, and lifestyle of the Akha hill tribe. Originally from southern China, the Akha people have migrated and established villages in the north of Myanmar and, eventually, settled in the north of Thailand over the past century. These vibrant communities prefer high-altitude living, typically residing at around 1,000 meters above sea level. Most Akha houses are built on the ground, featuring thatched roofs and bamboo walls, often situated on flat areas along mountain ridges. Agriculture, including crop cultivation and livestock rearing, forms the backbone of their economy. Household industries such as sewing, embroidery, and silverware crafting also contribute to their livelihood. Admire the Akha women's colorful dresses adorned with eye-catching silverware and multicolored beads, a tribal attire as captivating as that of other northern Thai tribes.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Venture to Doi Mae Salong, renowned for cultivating excellent tea and surrounded by breathtaking beauty. Green terraced tea plantations spread across the area, offering a serene and tranquil atmosphere for visitors to enjoy. Doi Mae Salong is a Chinese Yunnan village, whose residents immigrated to Thailand decades ago due to political changes in China. Scattered settlements emerged in northern Thailand in

1961, and the Thai government officially welcomed Chinese immigrants to settle in Thailand in 1972. Agriculture, particularly tea and various fruits and vegetables, became their primary occupation. Apart from the scenic terraced tea plantations and mountain vistas, the village exudes an ambiance reminiscent of a Chinese village in southern China.

Continue your journey to Chiang Rai to visit the impressive Wat Huay Pla Kang Temple. Perched atop a small hill, the temple boasts stunning views of its surroundings. Notably, the temple's 9-storey, 12-sided chedi captivates with its unique shape adorned with intricate Chinese and Lanna arts. The chedi's red roof is flanked by two majestic dragon statues, leading visitors up the stairs to its peak. Inside the chedi, an exquisite large sandalwood statue of the Goddess Guan Yin Bodhisattva graces the space. The temple also features a 69-meter-tall statue of Guan Yin Bodhisattva, nearly the height of a 25-storey building, with an elevator system providing easy access for tourists to enjoy breathtaking views of Chiang Rai. As the day comes to an end, find comfort and rest in Chiang Rai, reflecting on the captivating experiences of the journey and the beauty of the destinations explored.

This graceful two-story structure, built of brick and mortar, harmoniously blends Western and Thai architectural influences and serves as a captivating gateway into the region's past. Within its halls, visitors encounter a remarkable array of artistic relics, sacred objects, and cultural treasures that illuminate the traditions of northern Thailand's native communities and the diverse hill tribes who have long made the area their home. Each display conveys stories of endurance, heritage, and adaptation, offering a profound appreciation of Nan's cultural identity. Complementing the artifacts are educational exhibits and historical accounts that trace Nan's journey from a modest kingdom to a thriving province. Before departing, pause at the museum's iconic frangipani tunnel arch, where rows of trees form a natural

canopy. During the flowering season, the air is filled with a gentle fragrance and sunlight filters through the leaves, casting dappled patterns along the walkway. This serene passageway has become a beloved spot for visitors, providing both a picturesque photo opportunity and a tranquil moment of reflection amid nature's beauty.

Next, continue on to the Nan Noble House, locally cherished as Hong Chao Fong Kham. This ancestral home of Lanna nobility has stood for over a century, preserving echoes of lineage and tradition. Originally constructed for Chao Srithumma, grandson of Chao Mahawong—the twelfth ruler of Nan from the distinguished Thinnawong dynasty—the residence was later inherited by Chao Fong Kham, ensuring the continuity of noble heritage. The house exemplifies classic Lanna craftsmanship: a raised teakwood dwelling crowned with a steep clay-tiled roof, its four wings linked by verandas and walkways, with a front staircase sheltered beneath its own roof. Surrounding the main residence are the kitchen, granary, water well, and rice-milling mortar, each reflecting the rhythms of daily life from generations past. Every timber was hand-hewn and joined with wooden pegs rather than nails, a testament to patience and skill. The compound is shaded by verdant trees, while a clear well mirrors the sky. Inside, rooms remain carefully preserved, displaying garments, furnishings, and household items that vividly portray life in earlier times. A dedicated exhibition showcases antiques once used within the household, bridging past and present. Beyond its historical significance, the Noble House serves as a living classroom, where visitors can observe the art of traditional cotton weaving—from planting and spinning to dyeing threads with natural colors such as deep black from makluea fruit, radiant red from lac, and golden yellow from turmeric. The weaving process culminates in fabrics of exquisite beauty, each piece a story woven by hand. The rhythmic sound of the loom, the brilliance of natural dyes, and the devotion of artisans together create an atmosphere that is both educational and deeply inspiring.

Then continue to Wat Phra That Khao Noi, a serene and spiritually significant temple perched atop the picturesque Khao Noi Mountain. The ascent—whether by climbing the iconic staircase or driving along the winding mountain road—offers a rewarding experience, granting visitors breathtaking panoramic views of Nan city and its lush surroundings. At the heart of this sacred site lies the relic pagoda, a beautiful fusion of Burmese and Lanna architectural styles. The pagoda is said to enshrine a relic of the Buddha's hair, making it a revered destination for both locals and visitors seeking spiritual solace. The intricate designs and craftsmanship of the structure reflect the rich cultural heritage of the region. A highlight of the visit is the golden Buddha statue, majestically poised atop the mountain. This towering figure, gazing out over the landscape, exudes a sense of peace and serenity. Pilgrims and tourists alike often come here to seek blessings, meditate, or simply bask in the tranquil atmosphere. For photography enthusiasts, Wat Phra That Khao Noi is a treasure trove of stunning vistas and architectural beauty. The temple's elevated position provides an excellent vantage point to capture the sprawling beauty of Nan city, particularly during sunrise or sunset, when the landscape is bathed in warm, golden hues.
