Next, pay your respects at the revered Wat Phra That Doi Kong Mu temple. This sacred site, perched atop Kong Mu Mountain, is considered the most important place of worship in Mae Hong Son. The temple complex includes two pagodas of different sizes, each with its own historical significance. The smaller pagoda was constructed by Chong Thong Su, a Shan merchant, in 1860, while the larger one was built by Phraya Singhanatracha, the first ruler of Mae Hong Son, in 1874. From this elevated vantage point, you can marvel at the breathtaking natural panorama of the town, surrounded by majestic mountains and lush valleys. Continue your temple exploration with visits to Wat Chong Kham and Wat Chong Klang, two neighboring temples that boast splendid Burmese-style architecture. These temples are home to the revered Buddha image, Luang Paw To. Inside Wat Chong Klang, you'll find an impressive collection of Burmese wood carving dolls and magnificent glass paintings that depict various scenes from Buddhist history. These artistic treasures offer a glimpse into the rich cultural heritage and artistic traditions of the region.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Explore the awe-inspiring Su Tong Pe Bridge, an extraordinary bamboo structure acclaimed as Thailand's longest bamboo bridge. This impressive bridge links Suan

Tham Phusama Temple with Kung Mai Sak village, elegantly spanning paddy fields and canals. The bridge not only serves as a crucial pathway for monks and villagers but also leaves an indelible impression on visitors with its timeless charm. The beauty of Su Tong Pe is particularly striking during the rainy season when the surrounding fields are lush and green. The bridge feels like a natural extension of the vibrant landscape, inviting you to pause and appreciate the serenity of the setting. Equally captivating are the winter months when the golden grains of rice shimmer under the sun, creating a picture-perfect backdrop that highlights the bridge's rustic elegance.
