Wat Chedi Luang Worawihan is also known by several names, including Rajakudakan Temple and Chotikaram Temple, each reflecting its rich history and cultural importance. It is believed to have been constructed during the reign of King Prachao Sanmuangma, the seventh king of the Mangrai dynasty, with its origins dating back to approximately 1391. Though the exact year of construction remains uncertain, the temple has long stood as an ancient royal sanctuary, undergoing numerous restorations over the centuries. Today, it boasts an impressive width of 60 meters on each side, making it one of the most significant pagodas in Chiang Mai. As you explore the magnificent Wat Chedi Luang Worawihan, you will be immersed in the storied past of Chiang Mai and the timeless beauty of its architectural heritage. Its enduring significance as both a cultural and spiritual landmark ensures that every visitor departs with a lasting impression of its grandeur and historical importance.

Our first stop takes you to the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon, a haven of beauty where colorful flower plots and a diverse array of vegetables and fruits flourish. This research station serves as a focal point for studying winter plants, conducting vital research on flowers, ornamental plants, vegetables, fruits, and highland fisheries. The knowledge gained here is not only shared through promotion but also contributes to fundamental development, social progress, and the conservation of forest watersheds. One of the remarkable aspects of the Royal Agricultural Station Inthanon is the positive impact it brings to the lives of hill tribe farmers in the nearby villages. By generating income through sustainable agricultural practices, the project uplifts these communities and fosters a harmonious relationship with the environment. Witnessing the vibrant flora and the thriving agricultural practices, visitors are left mesmerized by the significance of this research station in supporting local livelihoods and preserving the region's natural heritage.

Next, behold the awe-inspiring Wachirathan Waterfall, one of Thailand's most magnificent natural wonders. Additionally, the cool weather throughout the year offers panoramic views that rank among the most breathtaking in Chiang Mai.

These large, geyser-like springs present a mesmerizing display of rising steam, accompanied by the faint scent of sulfur drifting through the air. As you approach, you'll be greeted by the sight of four expansive ponds and several smaller ones, each surrounded by dense jungle. The area is ideal for nature study, with a 1.5-kilometer trail winding through the forest beneath towering trees, ferns, and moss-covered paths. The serene ambiance, combined with the soothing sounds of flowing water and birdsong, makes this a perfect place for relaxation and rejuvenation. Take a moment to dip your feet into the warm mineral-rich waters and experience their gentle healing properties. For those who enjoy slow exploration, the trail offers opportunities to observe butterflies, wildflowers, and even small forest animals, making the hot springs not only a place of rest but also a living classroom of natural wonders.

Next, continue your journey to the captivating Mork Fah Waterfall in Doi Suthep-Pui National Park. Though not the largest waterfall in the region, this single-tiered cascade flows year-round, fed by streams from the dense forest above. The intricate carvings, vibrant murals, and ornate decorations reflect the artistry and craftsmanship of the Lanna Kingdom, offering a glimpse into the rich history and traditions of Northern Thailand.

The journey then leads you to the unique Hinoki Land, the first and only hinoki wood kingdom in Thailand. This extraordinary destination captures the essence of Japanese art, culture, and architecture within its expansive 83-rai area. You will visit Suan Roi Jai Rak, a garden plantation boasting a variety of winter flowers and vegetables for tourists to admire. The vibrant blooms and meticulously maintained gardens provide a feast for the eyes, with each season bringing new colors and fragrances. The garden serves as an educational hub, teaching visitors about sustainable agriculture and traditional farming practices. Near Suan Roi Jai Rak is Kad Luang Roi Jai Rak, a market where villagers offer fresh produce and handicrafts for visitors to choose from. The market is a bustling hub of activity, with stalls overflowing with colorful fruits, vegetables, and handmade goods.

Their traditional attire is especially striking: women wear colorful dresses and elaborate hats adorned with shimmering silver ornaments and multicolored beads, each piece symbolizing cultural identity and heritage. These vibrant costumes not only showcase their artistry but also embody the spirit and beauty of the Akha tribe, leaving a lasting impression on visitors.

Chinese immigrants, allowing them to settle in the area. Embracing a life in agriculture, the immigrants cultivated tea, along with a variety of vegetables and fruits for trade. As a result, Doi Mae Salong flourished not only with the beauty of terraced tea plantations and stunning mountain scenery but also with an atmosphere reminiscent of a traditional Chinese village in the southern regions of China. The plant is a fascinating blend of history and practicality, offering insights into the region's past and its resourceful use of natural materials. The salt produced here is not only a vital ingredient for the local cuisine but also a valuable commodity that has played a significant role in the area's economy.

From Bo Kluea, continue your journey to the awe-inspiring Doi Phu Kha National Park, one of Nan's crown jewels. As you ascend to the park's famed viewpoint, located at an elevation of approximately 1,715 meters above sea level, you'll be greeted by cool, refreshing mountain air and panoramic views of the surrounding peaks and valleys. Inside, you will discover an impressive collection of art antiques, religious artifacts, and cultural treasures that reflect the way of life of the native people of northern Thailand, as well as the diverse hill tribes who have settled in the area over centuries. Each exhibit tells a story of resilience, tradition, and adaptation, allowing visitors to gain a deeper appreciation of Nan's rich heritage. Beyond the artifacts, the museum also provides educational displays and historical narratives that trace Nan's transformation from a small kingdom to a vibrant province, making it an invaluable stop for those eager to understand the cultural identity of the region. Before leaving, don't miss the chance to capture memorable photos at the frangipani tunnel arch in front of the museum, where rows of frangipani trees form a natural canopy, creating a serene and picturesque walkway. The tunnel is especially enchanting during the blooming season, when the delicate fragrance of the flowers fills the air and sunlight filters through the leaves, casting dappled shadows along the path. This tranquil spot has become a favorite among visitors, offering not only a perfect photo opportunity but also a moment of quiet reflection amid the beauty of nature.

From there, continue your journey to the Nan Noble House, affectionately known by locals as Hong Chao Fong Kham. This ancestral residence of the northern Lanna nobility has stood for more than a century, carrying with it the whispers of history and heritage. Originally built for Chao Srithumma, grandson of Chao Mahawong—the twelfth ruler of Nan from the illustrious Thinnawong dynasty—the house was later passed down to his descendant, Chao Fong Kham, preserving the noble lineage of Nan's rulers. The house itself is a masterpiece of traditional Lanna architecture: a raised teakwood structure crowned with a steep gabled roof tiled in clay. Four wooden wings interconnect through verandas and walkways, with a front staircase sheltered beneath its own roof. Beyond the main residence lie the kitchen, granary, water well, and rice-milling mortar, each echoing the rhythms of daily life from generations past. Every beam of teak was hand-hewn with axe and blade, joined not with nails but with wooden pegs and intricate joinery—a testament to craftsmanship, patience, and the enduring wisdom of Lanna artisans. In front of the house, a clear well reflects the sky, while lush trees surround the compound, offering shade and serenity. Step inside and you'll find rooms remarkably well-preserved, with household items, garments, and furnishings carefully arranged to paint a vivid portrait of life in bygone days. A dedicated exhibition space displays treasured antiques of Nan, each piece once used within the household itself, bridging past and present. Yet the Noble House is more than a monument to history—it is also a living classroom. Visitors can witness the art of traditional cotton weaving, beginning with the planting of cotton, the spinning of yarn through local wisdom, and the dyeing of

threads with natural colors: deep black from makluea fruit, radiant red from lac, and golden yellow from turmeric. Finally, the threads are woven with skill and patience into fabrics of exquisite beauty, each piece a story woven by hand. The rhythmic clatter of the loom, the vibrant hues of natural dyes, and the dedication of the artisans together create an atmosphere that is both educational and profoundly moving.

Lunch at the restaurant.

After lunch, continue your journey to Wat Phra That Khao Noi, a tranquil and spiritually significant temple gracefully perched atop the picturesque Khao Noi Mountain. The ascent itself—whether by climbing the iconic staircase adorned with mythological motifs or driving along the winding mountain road—offers a rewarding experience, gradually unveiling sweeping vistas of Nan’s lush and verdant landscape. At the summit, the panorama unfolds in all directions, with Nan city nestled amidst rolling hills and lush greenery, a sight that instantly instills a sense of peace and wonder. At the heart of this sacred site lies the relic pagoda, a graceful fusion of Burmese and Lanna architectural styles. Said to enshrine a relic of the Buddha’s hair, the pagoda has long been a revered destination for locals and pilgrims seeking blessings and spiritual solace. Its intricate stucco designs and delicate craftsmanship reflect the region’s rich cultural heritage, each detail imbued with symbolic meaning. A highlight of the temple is the golden Buddha statue, majestically poised atop the mountain, gazing serenely across the valley. This towering figure radiates tranquility, inviting visitors to pause, meditate, and embrace the calm atmosphere. For photography enthusiasts, Wat Phra That Khao Noi offers endless inspiration—the elevated vantage point is particularly magical at sunrise or sunset, when warm golden light bathes the landscape and the city below glimmers in soft hues.

Conclude your exploration with a visit to Wat Phumin, a revered temple that has stood for over 400 years. Its architecture is distinctive, seamlessly blending the form of an ubosot with that of a pagoda to create a harmonious structure found nowhere else. Inside the central hall, four majestic Buddha images sit back-to-back, each facing a different direction, symbolizing the omnipresence of the Buddha’s teachings throughout the world. The temple is celebrated for its captivating “Hoop Tam” mural paintings, which vividly portray Jataka tales and local legends. These intricate works are not only artistic masterpieces but also cultural narratives, offering profound insights into the values and beliefs of the people who created them. Among the most iconic is the “Pu Man Ya Man” painting, depicting a tender whispering lovers’ scene that has become emblematic of Nan’s artistic heritage. After immersing yourself in the wonders of Nan province, continue onward to Phrae, known as the gateway to the Lanna Kingdom. With its rich history and diverse attractions—including temples, natural landscapes, and museums—Phrae promises an enchanting experience. Upon arrival, check into your hotel and enjoy a restful overnight stay.

**DAY 13** Phrae – Sukhothai: Phae Mueang Phi Forest Park / Wat Pong Sunan Temple / Khum Vongburi Museum / Khum Chao Luang / (Ancient Thai House) (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Before departing from Phrae for Sukhothai Province—a land abundant in natural wonders and cultural treasures—you will first enjoy a memorable visit within Phrae

itself. Your journey begins at the captivating Phae Mueang Phi Forest Park, also known as the Ghost Pillars. This enchanting site reveals a surreal landscape sculpted by nature, where soil and sandstone formations have been eroded over centuries into striking shapes. Towering clay pillars, cliffs, and mushroom-like structures rise dramatically from the ground, creating an otherworldly scene that feels almost mystical. Established on March 4, 1981, and covering more than 40 acres, the park is a geological marvel that continues to fascinate scientists, nature enthusiasts, and curious travelers alike. As you wander along the well-maintained nature trail, you will encounter informative signs explaining the park's geological features, offering insights into the forces of erosion and time that shaped this unique terrain. The trail invites visitors not only to admire the formations but also to deepen their understanding of the delicate balance of natural processes. The quiet forest surroundings, punctuated by birdsong and the gentle rustle of leaves, heighten the sense of mystery and wonder. For photographers, the contrasting textures of clay pillars against the greenery and sky provide endless opportunities to capture the haunting beauty of this extraordinary landscape.

From this natural spectacle, continue your exploration to Wat Pong Sunan Temple, a tranquil sanctuary imbued with cultural and historical significance. The temple grounds immediately impress with a large golden reclining Buddha positioned near an auspicious archway, a radiant sight that draws visitors into its serene embrace. Within the ubosot (ordination hall), the enshrined Buddha image known as Phra Chao Saen Suk—over 500 years old—stands as a revered symbol of devotion, while the pagoda nearby is said to contain relics of the Lord Buddha, adding to the temple's spiritual importance. One of the most intriguing features of Wat Pong Sunan is the 108 Phra That Chedi Wiharn Kaew, a striking white temple adorned with 108 pagodas. Surrounding the structure is a wall embedded with 108 plexiglass balls, which create a fascinating optical illusion: when gazed upon, the pagodas appear beautifully inverted, shimmering like reflections in water. This unique visual effect adds a layer of wonder to the temple's design, blending artistry with symbolism. Inside the viharn (assembly hall), a large Buddha image named Phra Saraswadee Prathanpon presides with quiet majesty. The walls are adorned with captivating murals that depict Buddha images in Phrae Province alongside representations of various zodiac years, weaving together spiritual teachings with cultural artistry. Each mural tells a story, offering visitors a glimpse into the beliefs, traditions, and creative spirit of the region.

Lunch at the restaurant.

After lunch, a visit to Khum Wong Buri—an over 100-year-old, distinctive pink Thai house—offers a captivating glimpse into the rich history and unique architectural styles of the past. This remarkable residence, built in 1897 by Mae Chao Bua Tha, the first consort of Chao Luang Piriyaathepwoong, the last ruler of Phrae, stands as a testament to cultural heritage. Khum Wong Buri is a grand two-storey golden teakwood house that harmoniously blends Thai-Lanna and European architectural elements. Its construction showcases traditional Thai craftsmanship: instead of nails, wooden tongues are inserted and secured with wedges, reflecting the artistry of the era. Originally, the roof was thatched with wooden pads, lending a distinctive appearance. Over time, the roofing material was replaced first with galvanized sheets and later with tiles, while decorative stencil wood patterns—popular during King Rama V's reign—adorn the exterior, embellishing gables, roof ridges, eaves, air vents, doors, windows, and balcony frames. Inside, intricate motifs of plants and

vines enhance the house's charm. Khum Wong Buri also features intriguing rooms, including Chao Mae Bua Tha's chamber, the living room, and the bedroom, each furnished with antique treasures: cabinets, beds, tables, chairs, dressing tables, cups, bowls, silverware, ancient weapons, and Buddha images from the Chiang Saen and U-Thong periods. Historic photographs line the walls, narrating the fascinating story of this house and the lives once sheltered within.

Continuing your journey, you will explore Khum Chao Luang, another venerable residence in Phrae. Built in 1892 by Chao Luang Piriyaathepwoong, the last ruler of Phrae, this valuable building exemplifies a refined blend of Thai-Lanna and European architectural styles. The two-storey structure rests upon solid wooden logs rather than piles, adding to its architectural distinction. Beneath the house lie three rooms once used for storing belongings, money, and treasures. Khum Chao Luang is gracefully adorned with fretwork and intricately carved patterns, the handiwork of renowned Chinese artisans of the time. Its 72 windows and doors, shingle roofs known as Mai Pan Kled, the Pan-Yah style roof with a rectangular porch, and the triangular porch roof together create an exquisite visual harmony. The gables and eaves, embellished with finely carved fretwork, further elevate the building's aesthetic allure.

After immersing yourself in Phrae's historical treasures, your journey continues to Sukhothai Province, the ancient capital of Thailand. Rich in historical significance, Sukhothai invites you to step back into the past through its renowned World Heritage Sites, including Sukhothai Historical Park and Si Satchanalai Historical Park. Amidst these monumental legacies, Sukhothai retains a simple, traditional way of life, set against a backdrop of serene natural landscapes. Here, you will have the opportunity to experience a unique blend of culture and nature, deepening your appreciation of Thailand's heritage during your stay in Sukhothai.

**DAY 14** Sukhothai - Lampang: Sukhothai Historical Park / Si Satchanalai Historical Park (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

The peaceful surroundings, combined with the historical significance, make this park a place where history and nature coexist in harmony.

A delightful carriage ride awaits in Lampang city, where you'll gain a glimpse into local life while exploring the city's historical charm. Once the main mode of transport along Lampang's prosperous economic roads, horse-drawn carriages remain a beloved symbol of the province. Today, they are preserved as a cultural treasure and used as a nostalgic means of transport for visitors. As you ride through the streets, you'll pass ancient buildings and heritage architecture that hark back to the city's past glory, offering a living connection to Lampang's rich history.
