Nestled deep within the lush expanse of Doi Inthanon National Park, this towering 70-meter cascade offers a spectacular visual and sensory experience that captivates everyone who visits. The waterfall maintains a strong flow throughout the year, ensuring that its dramatic beauty can be appreciated in every season. During the rainy months, the scene becomes even more enchanting, as shimmering rainbows often form in the misty spray, creating a magical, storybook atmosphere. The water thunders down the rugged cliff face with impressive force, generating a cool, refreshing mist that blankets the area and offers a pleasant respite on warmer days. The ambiance is both tranquil and invigorating, enhanced by the dense forest canopy

Surrounding the pagodas are beautifully landscaped gardens, bursting with vibrant winter blooms and a variety of ornamental plants that thrive in the cool highland climate. These sacred structures are not only architectural masterpieces but also cultural landmarks that attract visitors year-round, who come to admire their beauty, pay their respects, and soak in the tranquil ambiance of the mountaintop.

From the pagodas, continue onward to the summit of Doi Inthanon—the highest peak in Thailand, standing proudly at 2,565 meters above sea level. As part of the Thanon Thongchai Mountain Range, which extends from the Himalayas through Nepal, Bhutan, and Myanmar, Doi Inthanon is both a geological and ecological treasure. The ascent to the summit takes you through an enchanting transition of forest types, from lush rainforests and fragrant pine groves to mixed woodlands, each brimming with unique flora and fauna. DAY 03 Chiang Mai - Phitsanulok: Wat Phra That Doi Phra Chan Temple / Sukhothai Historical Park (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)

Depart from Chiang Mai and journey south toward Lampang, where your first destination is the magnificent Wat Phra That Doi Phra Chan, perched atop the tranquil Doi Phra Chan Mountain in Mae Tha District. Renowned for its exquisite Lanna-style architecture and serene atmosphere, this sacred temple has become a cherished destination for travelers seeking both cultural enrichment and spiritual tranquility. Reaching the temple is an experience in itself: visitors may ascend the mountain via the impressive Naga staircase, a captivating pathway of several hundred steps, or conveniently drive to the summit. Upon arrival, guests are welcomed by an elegant ordination hall housing the principal Buddha image, depicted in a peaceful meditation posture. Inside, the hall is adorned with intricate gilded wood carvings that beautifully showcase the refined artistry of the Lanna tradition. Nearby stands the graceful white chedi of Phra That Doi Phra Chan, crowned with multiple tiers of golden spires that enhance the temple's enchanting atmosphere and radiate a profound sense of peace and spirituality. A short climb further uphill reveals one of the temple's most remarkable highlights—a magnificent replica of the Great Buddha of Kamakura, or Phra Amitabha Buddha, inspired by the famous Kotoku-in Temple in Kamakura, Japan. Majestically situated on the hillside, this impressive statue symbolizes harmony, friendship, and cultural exchange between nations. As visitors explore the temple grounds, they are rewarded with breathtaking panoramic views of the surrounding countryside, encompassing the picturesque landscapes of Mae Tha District and beyond. These sweeping vistas deepen the sense of serenity and connection with nature, making every moment at the summit truly memorable. Combining architectural splendor, spiritual significance, and awe-inspiring scenery, Wat Phra That Doi Phra Chan offers an unforgettable experience for those seeking inner peace, cultural discovery, and contemplative reflection. As one of Lampang's most treasured landmarks, the temple stands as a testament to the province's enduring charm, inviting travelers to immerse themselves in its rich cultural heritage, timeless beauty, and tranquil mountain setting.

Lunch at the restaurant.

Here, amidst tranquil landscapes and centuries-old ruins, visitors are invited to step back in time and discover the foundations upon which the Thai nation was built. Explore the park's remarkable collection of monuments and architectural treasures, beginning with the magnificent Wat Mahathat Temple, the spiritual and ceremonial center of the kingdom, renowned for its elegant lotus-bud chedi and serene Buddha images that embody the artistic brilliance of the era. Continue to admire the balanced design of Wat Chana Songkhram Temple, the peaceful beauty of Wat Traphang Ngoen

Temple reflected beside its picturesque pond, and the distinctive Khmer-inspired architecture of Wat Sri Sawai Temple, whose unique style reveals the diverse cultural influences that once shaped the region. Each monument offers a fascinating glimpse into the religious devotion, artistic refinement, and sophisticated urban planning that characterized the golden age of Sukhothai. Beyond the boundaries of the ancient city walls, more than 70 additional archaeological sites await exploration, including the legendary Wat Si Chum Temple, famous for its colossal, seated Buddha image and mysterious hidden passageways that continue to intrigue historians and visitors alike. As you wander through these sacred ruins and historic grounds, you will gain a deeper appreciation of Sukhothai's profound influence on the development of Thai art, language, culture, and governance—an enduring legacy that can still be seen today in the Thai script and many aspects of modern Thai identity.

Discover the charming city of Phitsanulok, affectionately known as “Song Khwae,” meaning “the City of Two Rivers.” Steeped in centuries of history, this riverside destination offers a rich blend of cultural heritage, spiritual significance, and the enduring beauty of life along the banks of the Nan River. Exploring the city's most treasured landmarks provides an enriching opportunity to experience the essence of this historic province, where profound religious traditions, tales of heroic figures, and unique examples of local wisdom have been carefully preserved through generations. Even a single day in Phitsanulok can leave a lasting impression, offering memorable encounters that reflect the authentic character and cultural legacy of Northern Thailand. Begin your morning with a sense of peace and reverence at Wat Phra Si Rattana Mahathat Woramahawihan, more commonly known among locals as “Wat Yai.” This highly revered temple is home to the magnificent Phra Phuttha Chinnarat, the most sacred Buddha image in Phitsanulok and one of the most revered Buddha statues in the world. Renowned for what many regard as the most beautiful Buddha image in Thailand, the statue enchants visitors with its elegant proportions, exquisite craftsmanship, and radiant golden aureole that appears to emanate a profound sense of spiritual grace. Standing before this masterpiece often inspires feelings of serenity, admiration, and deep respect. Within the temple's main ordination hall, visitors can also appreciate the remarkable mother-of-pearl inlaid doors created during the reign of King Borommakot, outstanding examples of traditional Thai artistry that further enhance the temple's splendor and historical significance. After paying homage to the sacred Buddha image, continue toward the rear section of the temple grounds, where the principal Khmer-style prang stands majestically above the surrounding complex.

This ancient architectural landmark, representing the artistic influence of the early Ayutthaya Kingdom, has withstood the passage of time with remarkable dignity and beauty. Rising prominently against the skyline, it serves as a powerful symbol of the city's rich historical heritage and a lasting testament to the artistic and spiritual traditions that continue to shape the identity of Phitsanulok today.

Lunch at the restaurant.

The journey then leads to one of Phitsanulok's most intriguing cultural attractions, the Buranathai Buddha Casting Foundry (Cha Thavi). Far more than an ordinary workshop, this exceptional establishment is often regarded as a "living museum," where centuries-old craftsmanship continues to thrive and is openly showcased to visitors in its most authentic form. Here, you can witness the traditional art of Buddha image casting through the ancient Thai clay-mold technique, a revered practice that has been carefully preserved and handed down through generations of master craftsmen. The process begins with the meticulous creation of a wax model, a stage that demands remarkable attention to detail, patience, and artistic skill to achieve the graceful proportions and serene expressions characteristic of sacred Buddha images. Once the wax model has been completed, it is encased in layers of clay to form a mold. The mold is then heated, allowing the wax to melt away and leave behind a hollow cavity prepared for casting. Among the most fascinating stages of the process is the careful pouring of molten brass into the mold, a transformative moment when the artisan's vision gradually takes shape as a solid sculpture. This intricate and labor-intensive craft combines artistic expertise, spiritual dedication, and technical precision, requiring years of experience to master fully. The completed Buddha images are renowned for their exceptional quality and refined beauty, with many reproducing the distinctive features of Phra Phuttha Chinnarat with remarkable accuracy. As a result, the foundry has earned a distinguished reputation as one of Thailand's most respected centers for the creation of Buddha images, celebrated for both their artistic excellence and profound spiritual significance.

From the Buranathai Buddha Casting Foundry, a short walk across the road brings you to another cultural treasure, the Sergeant Major Thawee Folk Museum. This remarkable museum is a treasure trove of traditional wisdom, created through the lifelong dedication of Sergeant Major Thawee Buranakhet, who devoted his time, resources, and passion to collecting countless everyday objects once used by communities across Thailand's lower northern region. His vision was to preserve these humble yet meaningful artifacts so that future generations could better understand how people in the past lived, worked, and adapted to their environment. The museum complex consists of several exhibition buildings, each thoughtfully arranged to present different aspects of traditional life and local culture. Inside, visitors will discover an astonishing variety of artifacts—from ingeniously designed tools used for catching fish and aquatic animals, to beautifully crafted woven baskets, farming equipment, occupational tools, and even rare traditional toys that are seldom seen today. Many of these items were handmade from natural materials such as bamboo, wood, rattan, and clay, reflecting the resourcefulness of rural communities. Walking through the museum feels much like opening an encyclopedia of Thai rural life, revealing the remarkable ingenuity with which past generations transformed simple materials into practical tools that supported a self-sufficient, resourceful, and sustainable way of living. The museum not only preserves objects but also keeps alive the stories, skills,

and wisdom of earlier generations, making it a deeply meaningful place to explore local heritage. Once the exploration of Phitsanulok's landmarks is complete, the inter-provincial journey begins again, departing from Phitsanulok to Ayutthaya. Arriving in Ayutthaya in the evening, check into the hotels to rest or explore the city's nightlife at your leisure.

DAY 05 Ayutthaya – Kanchanaburi: Ayutthaya Historical Park / Chao Phraya River Cruise (Hotel / Breakfast / Lunch)
